Letter from the President

Dear Supporters,

As your Council President it gives me great pleasure to present to you the 2010 Annual Report of the Pennsylvania Dutch Council.

Thank you for “Celebrating the Adventure – Continuing the Journey”!

This was the year long theme of the 100th anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America; a year in which you, our Scouting families, and Scouting Alumni applauded the many successes of Scouting’s history and looked to what the future would bring. Programs to highlight leadership accomplishments, civic achievements, and character development were held across our Council and across the nation. The 100th anniversary marked a remarkable measure of accomplishment but also a beginning of a new path for Scouting.

Throughout the year-long celebration we held events such as the Hall of Leadership, recognizing the leadership of twelve incredible individuals, who through their involvement in Scouting provided personal impact on the lives of others. The Alumni Connection team connected us to over 300 of you who had once been involved in Scouting but were no longer registered with the program. Eagle Scouts soared to J. Edward Mack Scout Reservation to reunite and share in the fellowship. Many of our Scouting families joined together to visit the 2010 Scout Jamboree in Virginia, seeking to share in this national experience.

Beyond the events and festivities of a national celebration, your Pennsylvania Dutch Council impacted on the lives of over 5,500 youth members. We carried on the mission of Scouting through the leadership of over 3,000 adult volunteers, who committed to delivering quality programs to the youth of Lancaster and Lebanon Counties. You, our investors, provided the financial support to carry out these programs of leadership, character development, and personal fitness. Your generosity allowed over 5,000 youth and adults to have an outdoor experience at our two Scout reservations throughout the year. The ScoutReach program continues to expand its outreach into the underserved sections of Lancaster and Lebanon cities and increased the program’s community partnerships by 50% in 2010, allowing more youth to join the program.

Each volunteer and supporter of Scouting is critical and we could not have made the impact on the lives of so many youth without your support. On behalf of the Pennsylvania Dutch Council, BSA Executive Board, I thank you for your support and leadership in helping us provide programs that have shaped our communities for the past 100 years and will continue to do so for the next century and beyond.

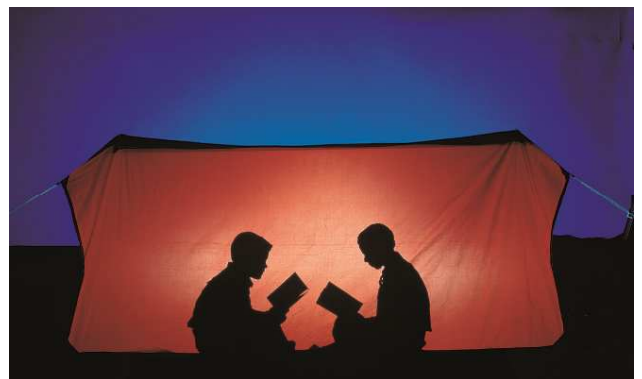
