WILDLIFE CONSERVATION AWARD PENNSYLVANIA GAME COMMISSION

The Pennsylvania Game Commission has, since 1957 made available to the Boy Scouts of America and other youth groups, a Wildlife Conservation Award. The award emblem, a blue keystone with a multicolored Ruffed Grouse and appropriately lettered in gold "Wildlife Conservation Award – Pennsylvania Game Commission", is very attractive.

The following information is given in order to explain our purpose in making this award available to list the requirements necessary for its presentation.

The commission's purpose in making this award available is to encourage Pennsylvania scouts in their study and knowledge of conservation and wildlife management. It is also designed as recognition of outstanding work in these fields. We do not propose that it should replace or be a substitute for any official Boy Scout program or award.

To be eligible for the Wildlife Conservation Award a boy must earn at least two merit badges from the Conservation Group (Fish and Wildlife Management; Bird Study; Mammals; or Forestry).

We realize that the value of any award, especially those given to youngsters, is in direct proportion to the amount of work necessary to earn it and the integrity of those responsible for its presentation. We, like you, must rely on the ability and good judgment of your merit badge counselors and your volunteer leaders. All we can hope for is that the Wildlife Conservation Award be granted fairly and honestly to boys who have really earned it.
