REGISTRATION DATES

1. Deposits-Due by March 15
2. Campership Forms-Due by March 15
3. Early Payments-Due by May 6

CAMP SESSIONS AND DATES

1. **Day Camp**-Open to All Cub Scouts – No Overnight
 - i. Dates-July 5-8
- b. **Weekend Resident Camp**-Open to All Cub Scouts - 2 night/3 day
 - i. Dates-Session #1: June 24-26, Session #2: July 1-3
 1. Friday to Sunday
- c. **Week-Long Resident Camp**-Open to All Cub Scouts - 5 night/6 day
 - i. Dates-Session #1: July 9-14, Session #2: July 16-21
 1. Saturday to Thursday
 - ii. Highly encouraged for Webelos so they get a full week camping experience before becoming Boy Scouts.
 - iii. Will include Webelos Outpost and Web. II Bashore Field Trip
- d. **Week-Long Resident Camp “Mini Week”** – Open to All Cub Scouts – 2 night/3 day
 - i. Dates-Session # 1: July 9-12, Session # 2: July 16-19
 1. Saturday to Tuesday right after breakfast
- e. **STEM Camp**-2 night/3 day for all ages and ranks
 - i. Dates-July 23-25
 - ii. Program focused on NOVA awards

 - a. Up to Pack to determine who free adults are
 - b. 1 adult free for every 5 Scouts attending the same camp session:

MEDICAL

1. Medical Forms
 - a. Only good for 12 months. Cannot expire before end of camp session
 - b. ALL CAMPERS (YOUTH & ADULT) MUST HAVE MEDICAL FORM
 - c. Forms by Camp:
 - i. Day Camp-Medical Form Parts A & B
 - ii. Weekend Resident Camp/STEM Camp-Medical Form Parts A & B
 - iii. -Medical Form Parts A, B, & C (Doctor's Physical)
 - iv. Week-Long Resident Camp-Medical Form Parts A, B, & C (Doctor's Physical)
2. Dietary Needs/Allergies
 - a. Need Dietary Needs Form filled out and attached to Medical Form
 - b. Will do best to accommodate but must know ahead of time

ADULT LEADERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. See Separate Page
2. Adults Changing through the session
 - a. Allowed provided adult to youth ratio is maintained
 - b. Adult splitting session pay one "space" fee as long as their stay does not over lap
 - i. If time will overlap, contact the council service center for cost.
3. ALL adults must complete Youth Protection Training and PA Background Clearances

OTHER COMMON QUESTIONS

1. When will they find out Camp Den/Campsite Assignments/Check-In Time?
 - a. Info in Confirmation letter sent last week of May

2. How will the program be structured?
 - a. For daily programs, Scouts will be divided into age group based Dens (Tigers, Wolves, Bears, Webelos). These Dens will be mixed groups with members from different packs. Dens will move through camp and get specific Age-Appropriate programs when they get to different program areas.

1. **Who needs a medical form?** - All youth AND adults coming to camp must have a current BSA medical form per BSA policies.
2. **What medical forms are needed?** - This varies by the type of camp you are attending:
 1. Day Camp - Medical Form Parts A & B
 2. Weekend Resident & STEM Camps - Medical Form Parts A & B
 3. Week-Long Resident Camp - Medical Form Parts A, B, & C (Doctor's Physical)
3. **How long are our medical forms good for?** - A BSA medical form is valid until the last day of the month one year from when it was first obtained. So if a Scout got a physical on July 5, 2015, the form is good until July 31, 2016. Again, everybody who camps with us needs a medical form.
4. **Where can I get the current and correct BSA Medical forms?** - To get fillable .PDF version of the current BSA medical form go to [BSA Medical Forms](#). After filling in the form, save it to your computer with a different file name.
5. **What if someone in our group has a Special Dietary Need?** - The food service staff at Camp Mack to their best to accommodate special dietary needs if they know about them ahead of time. Please have anyone with a special dietary need fill out and submit a [Special Dietary Needs](#) form at least two weeks prior to camp attendance.
6. **When do we need to turn in our Medical Forms? Because of insurance we can not get a physical until later.** - Having current medical forms for everyone in camp is important for everyone's safety and is extremely important in the event of an emergency. Keep the original forms and home and submit a copy! At the absolute latest, forms must be turned in the day of arrival. Anyone without a form will not be allowed to stay in camp longer than 24 hours, may not take a swim test, and may not participate in any strenuous activities. Best case scenario, forms are all turned in with your payments on May 8. Barring that, if forms can be turned in at least two weeks prior to camp, that gives the Camp Health Officer a chance to review them and call if any further information is needed.
7. **What immunizations are required/Will my child be barred from participating if we object to immunizations for medical/religious/philosophical reasons?** - The BSA's Immunization policy can be found here: [Report of the Immunization Task Force](#).
