Patrol Leader,

Please ensure that above all, you and your Patrol Have Fun!!!

Today you will utilize your basic Scouting skills to complete several stations that will test your ability to function as a Patrol.

When you get to a station: Stop outside the station before you enter, introduce yourself, and your Patrol (i.e. Patrol cheer) display your Patrol flag proudly, be courteous and respectful and make sure your Patrol is treating each other with respect as well. The Mayor at each station will hand you instructions for that station. Read the instructions over and ask any questions you might have; once your Patrol starts the task the Mayor **cannot** answer any questions, only point out rule violations.

Each Patrol will receive 5-bonus points for registering and camping over Friday night. Registering means that completed Patrol rosters/attendance sheets have been submitted prior to the Friday 9:30 PM Scoutmaster and SPL Meeting.

Each station is worth 20 points, the Mayor will record your score on their official score sheet and will also record <u>your</u> score on your unofficial scorecard (included in this packet). Please take a moment to look over the unofficial scorecard.

All 11 stations will be operational from 9:00 AM through 12:00 Noon and from 1:00 PM through 3:30 PM. Stations will be closed from 12:00 Noon to 1:00 PM for Lunch at Troop campsites. Adults will not be permitted to accompany Scouts along the trail, or to assist them at any stations. If adults provide directions and help on the station, the Patrol Leader will not be able to work efficiently in the "Patrol Method." If an adult helps your Patrol you could receive a 0 (zero) at that station. **Patrols please stay on the roads and trails!**

It is not necessary for all the Patrols of a particular Troop to be at the same station at the same time. We hope this year's Klondike will provide a learning experience and be fun for everyone. Patrol Leaders do the job you have been trained for. Let your Patrol become the team.

The last page of this packet is your Un-official Scorecard with your starting station highlighted - PLEASE GO THERE FIRST. There is no order for the rest of the day; you can do the other stations in any order you choose. (11 stations x 20 point per station = 220 possible points not counting bonus points).

Medical assistance will be available during the entire event. If an injury of any type occurs, please report it to headquarters as soon as possible so assistance can be rendered. (Headquarters is in Blair Lodge).

Look at your unofficial scorecard to find station locations. A camp map is also enclosed to find locations. If during the day there is a backup at a station, move on and come back to it later.

If you have any questions please refer them to your SPL or SM - if they do not know the answer - they can get it answered at Klondike Headquarters.

If you turn in a <u>Completed</u> Patrol Un-official Scorecard before 3:45 PM at Blair Lodge (Headquarters) your patrol will earn <u>10-bonus</u> points. In the event of a tie, the Scorecard turned in the earliest will win.

Equipment

All participants: Scouts and Adults need to bring a drinking cup!

Klondike Derby stations are designed to be completed with materials supplied by the station or with equipment the Patrol brings with them. The following list includes the minimum amount of materials needed to complete the stations.

Equipment per Scout:

- 1. Appropriate winter camping equipment, clothing and footwear as suggested by Scoutmaster.
- 2. Scout uniform modified to the weather.
- 3. Pocketknife, poncho, **compass**, pencil and paper, **scout handbook**, filled water bottle for drinking, and Scouting Spirit.
- 4. **ONE UNBREAKABLE CUP FOR DRINKING**!! No cups will be provided. Remember Scouts are Conservation Minded!!
- 5. Extra socks, shoes and clothes are recommended.

Waterproof / insulated boots are recommended – <u>No Sneakers</u>

Equipment for Patrol:

- 1. Klondike Derby Sled (Built to specifications)
- 2. Patrol Flag, Patrol Roster and Patrol Cheer (to be yelled).
- 3. First aid kit/equipment, cravats, bandaging materials, 2 blankets and 2-6ft staves.
- 4. Fire starting material: flint & steel, and hot spark are acceptable. Commercial products, chemical lighters, matches, steel wool and batteries are not.
- 5. No pre-built fire starters. Each patrol should supply/bring along their own tinder, kindling and wood; however, it must be as Mother Nature created. In other words, it must be "Wood not Lumber".
- 6. Helmet (required for sled rider)
- 7. Trash Bag (for trash)

Equipment for Troop:

- 1. Winter camping and cooking equipment as recommended by the BSA. If you have any questions concerning winter equipment we suggest you refer to Scouting publications.
- 2. Each Troop must supply their own meals.

Scoutmasters or Troop Leaders must have a completed troop roster to be turned in at registration. Patrols will not receive their "Patrol Packets" until we have a correct Troop roster.


