

Wilderness First Aid Training

Wilderness First Aid (WFA) is the assessment of and treatment given to an ill or injured person in a remote environment where definitive care by a physician and/or rapid transport is not readily available. Youth and adult Scout leaders 16 or older are invited to participate and earn their certification. For a full course overview go to http://www.cdsoutdoor.com/wfa.php.

Wilderness First Aid Training is required for Leaders attending any of the BSA High Adventure Bases and highly recommended for anyone participating in activities more than 30 minutes from emergency help.
