Auctions Again at the Fall Ordeal!

Again this September, WG39 will be holding two separate auctions at Fall Ordeal. We will hold our traditional Patch Auction following the ceremonies and start of cracker barrel on Saturday night. This auction is dependent on patch, pin, or scouting memorabilia donations from YOU! Please donate some items to the Patch Auction and bring cash with you to Fall Ordeal!

The Lodge will also hold a Silent Auction at Fall Ordeal. This auction will feature several unique pieces of Scouting memorabilia and other neat donations.

The Lodge is always looking for great donations for both auctions. Proceeds of the auctions benefit the Lodge Scholarship Fund.

Time to Pay Your Registration for NOAC 2020 is still open! We still have a few slots open.

The National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) is the premier event of the Order of the Arrow and is Scouting's second largest national event. Over 8,000 Arrowmen from across the country will gather for an inspirational and unforgettable experience full of fellowship, training, adventure and fun! During NOAC, Arrowmen will participate in a six-day conference which includes top notch training sessions, cool recreational opportunities, individual and team competitions, evening shows, and exciting programs.

The 2020 NOAC will be held from August 3 to August 8, 2020 at Michigan State University in East Lansing, Michigan. Arrowmen can travel to NOAC with a contingent from their lodge, or as a staff member supporting the thousands of Arrowmen attending in the conference.

The Lodge contingent will leave from Camp Mack on Sunday August 2nd, spend the night at a hotel in Michigan and then head to NOAC on Monday August 3rd. After NOAC, the Contingent will leave Lansing on Saturday August 8th and head to Cedar Point in Sandusky, OH for a day of fun at the amusement park and then stay close by to the park that evening. The Lodge will return to Camp Mack on Sunday August 9th. The cost of the contingent trip will be \$675 and will include shirts, patches, event registration, and the amusement park costs (among other items).

Wunita Gokhos Lodge is limited to the number of spots we are able to fill at the Conference and NOAC 2020 will sell out. If you are interested in attending with the contingent, you should register via the Lodge registration page at padutchbsa.org/programs/ order-of-the-arrow before September 1st. You must submit a refundable deposit of \$150 with your registration. Once the Lodge receives its final participant quota, the NOAC Selection Committee will convene to select those members that will represent the Lodge at NOAC 2020. Lodge members, both youth and adult, will be selected based on their commitment to the Lodge, Scouting background, and the required youth to adult ratio. Any Arrowmen not selected will have their \$150 deposit refunded. We will do our best to accommodate all requests to attend the conference, however, we will likely be limited in the number we can take with the Contingent. We will also maintain a waiting list if we do not obtain enough initial roster spots.

If you are interested in attending NOAC 2020, but are concerned about the cost of the event, please reach out to Eric Shea, Lodge Adviser, before September 1st to discuss your situation directly and to inquire about funding options.

As a reminder, the Lodge has an official refund policy that applies to all events the Lodge hosts. If you register for an event, but cannot attend and cancel before the registration deadline, you will receive a full refund. If you notify us after the deadline, but before the day of the event that you cannot attend, you will receive a refund of your registration fee less the identified food cost for the weekend. If you notify us the day of the event that you cannot attend or just do not show up to the event, no refund will be issued.

BSA Medical Forms Required on ALL Lodge and Section Weekends!

This is a reminder that official BSA Medical Forms are required for all OA weekends for all participants.

Although activities on OA weekends are not comparable to high adventure trips, sometimes people get sick or injured -- a nasty cut finger, a fall causing a swollen foot. We want to take the necessary precautions and be ready for that quick trip to the hospital for an x-ray or a few stitches. Should something happen, the Lodge health officer will need your medical form so your parents or guardian can be contacted and the health care providers have your current medical information.

If you have a current medical form, there is no need to get another physical, simply make a copy of your form and bring the COPY to the weekend. You can get the copy of your medical form back at the end of the weekend. Medical forms not picked up at the end of the weekend will be shredded. Since medical information can change, the Lodge does NOT keep medical forms from event to event. We want to ensure we have current information.
