Letter to the Parents

This is an unprecedented time in history, and we are doing our best to bring you activities that can be done at home or without directly interacting with other people. Your Cub will have the opportunity to learn, grow, and have fun!

The Super Cub “Around the House” Passport program was designed to give you, your Cub Scout, and your family an idea of the Cub Scouting program, and to keep you engaged during this time! Within this passport, you and your child will be given opportunity to explore four different themes. Each theme is meant to give your Cub Scout a better understanding of themselves and their local surroundings.

To achieve the “**Super Cub Home Award**”, your Cub Scout must complete 2 activities from each theme and 4 additional activities for a total of 12. If your Cub Scout completes the entire Super Cub “Around the House” Passport, your Cub Scout will achieve the “**Super Duper Cub Home Award**”! Whenever possible, have your Cub Scout tape, color, stick, draw, or stamp something from the activity in its box.

Once completed, fill out the form on the inside of the back page and send to your **Cubmaster or Den Leader** . They will order your Scouts patches.

Scouting at Home Patch



Cub Scouts who participate in the Super Cub “Around the House” Passport will be able to purchase a Pennsylvania Dutch Council Scouting at Home patch. Packs are asked to keep track of the number of Cub Scouts who participate and place an order for the patch as a pack. Patches will cost \$2 each and can be ordered online at <https://padutchforms.tentaroo.com/athomepatch>. **Patches must be ordered by June 1, 2020.** Patches will be available to pick up at the Council Service Center by mid July. The Pennsylvania Dutch Council Scouting at Home patch will not be available for purchase in the Scout Shop.

Cub Scouts: A Family Program

Family involvement is essential to Cub Scouting’s success. When we talk about “family” in Cub Scouting, we are sensitive to the realities of present-day families. Many Cub Scouts do not come from traditional two-parent homes. Some Cub Scouts live with a single parent or with other relatives or guardians. Cub Scouting considers a family to be the people with whom a Cub Scout lives.

Cub Scouts

In 1930, the Boy Scouts of America initiated a program to help younger boys (and since 2017, younger girls) called Cub Scouting. It is a year-round family program designed for boys and girls who are in Kindergarten through Fifth grade (or 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 years of age)

Kindergarteners are called Lion Cubs, and participate with an adult partner who works closely with the Scout.

First graders are called Tiger Cubs, and they too participate with an adult partner that works closely with them.

Second graders are called Wolf Cubs, and it is at this level that they begin to work more as a Den, with less one on one adult partner contact.

Third graders are called Bear Cubs. This is the level where the Scouts begin to have more intricate activities to prepare them for what lies ahead on the Scouting path.

Fourth and Fifth graders are called Webelos “**WE’LL BE LOYAL Scouts**”. This is the level where Scouts begin to do many more Scout skills and activities to prepare them to become Scouts in the Scouts BSA program!
