

- Between District/Council and Units








Within Units


- Be welcoming to new members
- Have a New Member Coordinator
- Try a quarterly, fun activity for families or adults
- Invite parents to committee or leadership meetings when appropriate





Between Units

- Reach out to do community outreach activities together
- Have joint activities and or meetings
 - (see next slide for details)
- Have joint adult social activities





Multi-Unit Activities


- With Charter Org approval:
 - Units from the SAME charter org may conduct any joint activities.
 - Units from DIFFERENT charter orgs may conduct joint day events, fundraisers, and community service events.
- In addition to Charter Org approval, Council approval is required for:
 - Overnight events with units from DIFFERENT charter orgs.
 - Note: Council approval alone of multi-unit events does not constitute a district or council event.





Between District/Council and Units

- Volunteer for District Activities such as Klondike or Fall Outpost
- Have OA members get involved
- Consider getting more Unit adults to Roundtable
- Have some adults volunteer for district service in:
 - Roundtable
 - Commissioner Service
 - District Committee
