You need to have a plan for the new leader









- PA State Police Criminal History
- PA Child Abuse History
- FBI Fingerprint Check
 - PA Resident for 10 years?
 YES = Submit Disclosure Statement for Volunteers
 NO = Submit FBI Fingerprint Check

S.A.F.E. Guarding Youth Training

Replaces Youth Protection Training


- Safeguarding Youth training is required for all Scouting America registered volunteers and is a joining requirement.
- Safeguarding Youth training must be taken every year. If a volunteer's Safeguarding Youth training is not current at the time of annual registration renewal, the volunteer will not be re-registered.

 - Complete Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) for Scoutmaster and Assistants





 - Leadership training course for adults
 - Conducted as:
 - An in-camp PRACTICAL phase where knowledge and skills are learned and practiced
 - An APPLICATION phase where the leader sets and works toward goals for the betterment of their scouting position.

Continuous Training

- Maintain required certifications
 - Maintain Safeguarding Youth (1yr)
 - Maintain Hazardous Weather Training (2yr) for direct contact leaders
 - Update Clearances every 5 years











Continuous Training

- Roundtable
