We are disappointed that we will not have our own contingent but have collaborated with our neighboring council, the Chester County Council, for you to have the opportunity to attend as a participant. #### **Commissioner Unit Award of Excellence**

The Commissioners within the PA Dutch Council have put together a program to recognize units for their efforts. To be awarded the Commissioners Unit Award of Excellence, a unit must meet minimum standards in 6 of the 9 areas below. The evaluation period will run from January 1 through November 30<sup>th</sup> and data will be drawn from the Unit Connections area in My.Scouting.org. For additional information click HERE.

- KEY LEADERS TRAINED: Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Crew Advisor and Committee Chair
- SIZE: Pack-20, Troop-12, Crew-7.
- GROWTH: Positive growth or super unit status
- ADVANCEMENT: 30% Rank advancement (crew leadership trained)
- OUTDOOR ACTIVITY: One pack outdoor activity, one troop long term camp or one crew tier 3 activity
- ROUNDTABLE ATTENDANCE: Unit participates in 6 out of 9 Roundtables (live streaming counts)
- RETENTION: At least 62%.
- SAFEGUARDING YOUTH TRAINING: 100% of adult leaders trained and certified, including the Chartered Organizational Representative
- SERVICE PROJECT: One documented unit service project in a calendar year.
